Public Health Preparedness

OPERE

Epidemiology

HHD's Bureau of Epidemiology prevents sickness and death from infectious diseases and environmental hazards through data analysis, education, surveillance, investigation, and health policy change.

Laboratory Services

HHD's Bureau of Laboratory Services plays a crucial role in the city's public health infrastructure, through highquality clinical and environmental laboratory support. The bureau provides timely laboratory testing that enables the health department to proactively address the health threats, protect and promote the overall well-being of Houstonians. Key responsibilities include Disease Surveillance and Detection, testing and analysis, environmental testing, notifiable disease reporting, and more.

Outbreak Management

HHD's Bureau of Outbreak Management protects public health by identifying the source and implementing control measures to prevent further spread or recurrence of the infection.



Units: Data Services

HHD's Data Services Unit gathers, analyzes and links information about people and their health to improve healthcare for all. Using health data for research to better understand diseases and health conditions, such as understanding their causes and symptoms or knowing how many people are affected.

Division of Family Services (WIC, Maternal, Child, Family Health & Human Services)

Area Agency on Aging (AAA)

HHD's Harris County Area Agency on Aging (AAA) provides federally funded social services for the elderly, as authorized by the Grants for Community Programs on Aging, Title III, Older Americans Act of 1965.

Human Services

HHD's Human Services Bureau helps Houstonians find stability and can include provision of basic needs such as food and shelter to offering counseling, guidance, and substance abuse treatment with the goal of promoting self-sufficiency and content in people's lives.

Women Infant Children (WIC)

HHD's WIC Bureau safeguards the health of low-income pregnant, postpartum, and breastfeeding women, infants, and children up to age 5 who are at nutritional risk by providing nutritious foods to supplement diets, information on healthy eating including breastfeeding promotion and support, and referrals to health care. including breastfeeding promotion and support, and referrals to health care.

Adolescent Health

HHD's Adolescent Health Division promotes adolescent health through comprehensive and age-appropriate programs and services. It aims to empower young individuals to make informed choices, build resilience, and lead healthy and fulfilling lives.

Children's Environmental Health

HHD's Children's Environmental Health Bureau's mission is to protect the developing children of Houston from environmental health hazards and promote a healthier environment.

Consumer Health

HHD's Consumer Health Bureau strives to protect the Houstonians through education and enforcement of local, state, and federal public health and environmental rules and standards as they relate to city-regulated waste, food safety, swimming pool safety, and ambulance services.

Environmental & Data Services

HHD's Environmental & Data Services Bureau provides leadership on environmental studies and has reviewed proposed state, federal and local environmental policies impacting the Greater Houston Area.

Pollution Control

HHD's Bureau of Pollution Control and Prevention was established in 1967 to decrease air pollution in Houston and expanded in 1973 when the Water Pollution Control Program was established. Since then, the bureau has grown to include Environmental Monitoring and Environmental Regulation Enforcement Divisions.

Vital Statistics

HHD's Bureau of Vital Statistics maintains records of births, deaths, and fetal deaths that occur in the incorporated city limits of Houston. Our core functions include records retention, serving as a liaison to the state, funeral home relations, and providing birth and death certificates to the public.



Community Health Services & Disease Prevention/Control

HHD's Community Health Services and Disease Prevention/Control Division provides community-based health services program which includes mobile health (curbside) services and community health and wellness centers to provide affordable, convenient, high quality healthcare services to Houston residents most in need. They work in partnership with the community to assess, plan, and implement effective public health strategies to reduce the spread of infectious diseases.

HIV/STD and Viral Hepatitis

HHD's Bureau of HIV/STDs and Viral Hepatitis is focused on addressing and combatting the spread of



sexually transmitted infections (STIs), human immunodeficiency virus resilient community by reducing the incidence of HIV, STIs, and viral hepatitis while promoting informed decision-making, and supporting the well-being of individuals and families affected by these infections.

Immunizations

HHD's Immunizations Bureau improves immunization coverage levels and protect Houston communities from vaccine-preventable diseases.

Oral Health Services

HHD's Oral Health Services is a specialized division dedicated to promoting and ensuring the oral health and well-being of the community. This income-friendly service provides comprehensive care services, education, and preventive measures to improve the dental health of individuals across all age groups.

Area Operations Support (Multi-Service Centers)

Multi-Service Centers Located around Houston, Houston Health Department's 12 Multi-Service Centers (MSC) offer spacious areas for public and private events for the surrounding communities. In partnership with collaborating agencies, HHD provides a variety of public services including educational resources, direct services, referrals, access to basic needs, and other social service needs.

Tuberculosis (TB)

HHD's Tuberculosis Bureau reduces the prevalence of tuberculosis in the greater-Houston area. Screens, identifies, and treats individuals with TB as well as partner with TB providers to ensure optimal TB care.





Health Centers

HHD operates 4 Health Centers (HC) across the Houston metro area that provide services meant to protect the health and social well-being of all Houstonians through quality care, access, research and education. Services are offered to all, regardless of ability to pay, at discounted/sliding fee scales. Health Centers also offer telemedicine visits to existing HHD patients with an active OCHIN MyChart. Community Nutrition

The goal of the Community Nutrition program is to provide sustainable alternatives for obesity prevention by promoting healthy lifestyles in communities through increased access to healthy, nutritious food options.

Formerly known as **"Community** Gardens" or "The Community Food Security Initiative"

Helps individuals understand the connection between healthy eating and chronic illness, develop volunteers as champions for healthy eating especially in communities with food access barriers, strengthen the capacity of community organizations to develop their own health living programs, and identify and address policies that contribute to food desserts.
